The Iona College men's basketball team (0-0) opens its 2020-21 campaign and the **Rick Pitino** Era tonight at Seton Hall (0-1) and the Prudential Center. In a match up that came together just over 48 hours ago, two of the top teams in the New York Metropolitan Area square off for the first time in 15 seasons.

IONA VS. SETON HALL - SERIES HISTORY

- Iona meets Seton Hall for the 39th time in history with the Pirates holding a 29-9 series advantage.
- This marks the first contest Iona will play in the Prudential Center, which opened in 2007.
- The Gaels are 2-19 all-time on Seton Hall's home floor.
- Iona has won two of the last three meetings, dating back to 1996.
- The Pirates toppled the Gaels on New Year's Eve in 2005, 73-59, marking Iona's final non-conference loss in a 7-2 showing away from the MAAC.

SCOUTING SETON HALL (0-1)

- Senior **Sandro Mamukelashvili** led three Pirates in double-figures with 22 points and 10 rebounds in a 71-70 loss at Louisville on Friday.
- Senior **Shavar Reynolds** and junior **Jared Rhoden** each had 11 points. Junior **Takal Molson**, a former Canisius standout, posted eight points in his Pirate debut.
- The Pirates are led by **Kevin Willard** in his 11th season. Willard was Iona's head coach from 2007-10, and a **Rick Pitino** assistant for the 10 previous years with the Boston Celtics from 1997-2001 and the University of Louisville 2001-07.
- One of the top Big East teams in the 2019-20 campaign, Seton Hall was picked to finish fifth this season.

LAST TIME VS. OPPONENT (DEC. 31, 2005, SHU 73, IONA 59)

Iona dropped its second straight contest to end the 2005 in a 73-59 loss at Seton Hall at Continental Airlines Arena. **Steve Burtt** netted 18 and **Ricky Soliver** scored 17 to lead the Gaels.

THE BIG STORY

- Iona College enters its first season under Hall of Fame head coach **Rick Pitino** in 2020-21
- Coach Pitino was tabbed to lead the program on March 14, 2020 after **Tim Cluess** stepped down for health reasons following the most successful decade in Iona basketball history.
- Coach Pitino spent the last two seasons Panathinaikos B.C. (PAN-ah-tin-IKE-ohs) in the EuroLeague in Greece.
- The Naismith Hall of Famer begins his 32nd year as a head coach of an NCAA Division I program.
- Coach Pitino has led Hawaii, Boston University, Providence, Kentucky and Louisville to 770 career wins, seven final fours, and two national titles among his numerous career accomplishments.
- The New York native returns home to the Metropolitan area where it all started. Growing up in Manhattan, Pitino starred for the CHSAA's St. Dominic High School on Long Island before his collegiate playing days at UMass and long coaching career.
- He also coached several years with the New York Knicks and Boston Celtics in the NBA.

IONA IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Gaels have posted a 50-23 record in their first game of the season since 1945.
- Iona opens the season on the road for the fifth time in six seasons.

GIST, ROSS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MAAC

- Seniors **Asante Gist** and **Isaiah Ross** were selected to the Preseason All-MAAC Second Team by the league's 11 head coaches.
- It was the second straight season for Gist on the preseason All-MAAC team. His season was cut short due to injury after 15 games in 2019-20.

GAELS PICKED SECOND IN MAAC PRESEASON POLL

- Iona was selected to finish second in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll released Nov. 5 coming off a sixth place performance in 2019-20.
- Siena, the reigning regular season champion, was picked first.
- The Gaels have captured a league best 10 regular season championships in 39 MAAC seasons.

KING OF THE HILL, TOP OF THE LIST

- No team among the 14 NYC Metropolitan Area Division I basketball programs within 30 miles of the center of NY College basketball, Madison Square Garden has won more games than Iona College in the last quarter century (465; Hofstra #2, 451).
- Over the last decade, Iona's 211 wins and .628 win percentage are also the best in both categories. (Seton Hall, 191 wins; .582 win pct.)
- Since 1995-96, the Maroon & Gold hold the lead in wins (465), 14 more than Hofstra, 35 more than No. 3 Seton Hall and the top win percentage (.584).
- Iona's nine postseason appearances (six NCAA, two NIT, one CIT) since 2010-11 are the most during the time frame, **almost twice as many** Seton Hall (4 NCAA, 1 NIT) and St. John's (three NCAA, two NIT).

- The MAAC recently announced its Time Out for Black Lives initiative, aiming to inspire and educate youth, athletes, families and fans.
- Time Out for Black Lives is an interactive website where coaches and student-athletes from MAAC basketball programs contribute their time and resources to read children's books in entertaining videos, all focusing on Black culture, history, music and myths.
- The program is a part of the MAAC's United for Justice campaign announced this summer.
- Iona head coach **Rick Pitino** participated in the effort, reading "A Nation's Hope: The Story of Boxing Legend Joe Louis," a story written by Matt De La Pena and illustrated by Kadir Nelson.

WHO'S BACK?

- Iona returns **just four** performers from the 2019-20 campaign including senior captains **Asante Gist, Isaiah Ross** and **Dylan van Eyck**.
- The Gaels' fourth senior, Colton Cashaw returns for his second season in Maroon & Gold.
- Walk on **Parker Weiss** also returns for year two.
- The Gaels graduated five student-athletes last season including All-MAAC performers **Tajuan Agee** and **E.J. Crawford** who have moved on to professional careers overseas.

WHAT'S NEW?

- Eleven players will make their Iona debut this season including eight recruited by **Rick Pitino** and staff following their hire in March.
- Juniors **Robert Brown** and **Berrick JeanLouis** were former teammates at New Mexico State reunited this year in New Rochelle. Brown joined the program in January 2020 while JeanLouis spent a year at Florida Southwestern State last season.
- Sophomore sharpshooter **Talik Chavez** spent a year at Garden City CC before becoming Coach Pitino's first verbal commitment in late March. His classmate **Osborn Shema** is one of the Gaels top newcomers. The 7-1 center is one of the tallest Gaels in the last two decades.
- Five rookies will make an immediate impact for the Gaels including three from overseas **Johan Crafoord** (Sweden), **Nelly Junior Joseph** (Nigeria) and **Dwayne Koroma** (Germany) and two New York City guards in **Ryan Myers** and **Omar Rowe**.
- The 11 first-year Gaels also include two walk-ons in sophomore **James Carey** freshman **Jordan Brooks**.

GAELS INK FOUR FOR 2021-22

- **Rick Pitino** and staff announced the signing of four student-athletes to NLI's this November.
- **Walter Clayton Jr.** is a 6-3 point guard from Lake Wales, FL and a top high-school program, Bartow. A top football recruit at multiple positions, he saw interest in Power 5 FBS programs in the sport, but chose basketball, his first love.
- **Joshua Duach** comes from Melbourne, Australia, and is a 6-6 combo guard with national team experience. He chose Iona over Maryland, Portland and Weber State.
- **Trey James**, a 6-10 forward, is one of the premier big men in the state of Kentucky, the Inez native broke the state's career blocks record as a junior. After originally committing to Wake Forest before a coaching change, he picked Iona over Iowa.
- **Jordan Wildy**, a 6-9 pick and pop forward, committed to Iona after a junior campaign with Moravian Prep, one of the top prep programs in the country. The Rock Hill, SC native is currently enrolled at Winston-Salem Christian School.

LET IT RAIN

- Following the completion of last season, Iona has made a three-pointer in **392** straight and **839** out of its last **841** games.
- Last season, the Gaels eclipsed their previous program record of 385 straight from Jan. 5, 1994 - Dec. 16, 2006.
- The Gaels have failed to hit a three-pointer in just 18 of their **1,067** games played since the line was adopted for the 1986-87 season.

RICHIE GUERIN'S #14 HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

- Iona honored the legacy of **Richie Guerin '54** by retiring his number 14 on Jan. 31, 2014 the first ever in school history.
- Guerin is an Iona College Goal Club (1983), Marine Corps Sports (2004), and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (2013) inductee

who starred for the Maroon & Gold from 1951-1954.

- He rewrote the basketball record books at Iona, scoring 1,375 points and graduated as the leading scorer in school history.
- A two-time All-Metropolitan selection with the Gaels, he scored a then school-record 40 points against John Carroll in 1954 and was the first Gael to score 40 or more points in a game.
- Following his playing days at Iona, Guerin played with the National Basketball Association's New York Knicks from 1956-1963 and was a player-coach of the St. Louis/Atlanta Hawks franchise for nine years.
- In 13 years as a professional player, Guerin accumulated 14,676 points (17.3 per game), 4,278 rebounds (5.1 per game), and 4,211 assists (5.0 per game) over 848 games.

GAEL GREATS

In addition to Naismith Hall of Famer **Richie Guerin '54**, here are additional significant names in Iona basketball history:


- **Jim Valvano** - legendary head coach at Iona from 1975-80 who "Dared To Dream" to win a national championship with the Gaels and finally did in 1983, albeit with North Carolina State. Succumbed to cancer in 1993 eight weeks after an impassioned speech at the ESPY Awards that year which in which he announced creation of The V Foundation for Cancer Research and its motto, "Don't Give Up... Don't Ever Give Up."
- **Jeff Ruland '91** - All-American during his time at Iona and, two-time NBA All-Star with the Washington Bullets, Philadelphia 76ers and Detroit Pistons. Following his career, returned to Iona and served as head coach from 1998-2007 where he won three MAAC Championships.
- **Tim Cluess** - head coach from 2010-2020. At the helm during one the Gaels' most successful decades in program history. Cluess won 199 games in nine seasons on the sideline including six NCAA appearances, five MAAC tournament championships, and four MAAC regular season titles. He is the all-time MAAC leader in MAAC tournament victories.
- **Pat Kennedy** - head coach from 1980-86. Went on to coach at Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson following a highly successful tenure in New Rochelle. He was most recently head coach at Div. II Pace University.
- **Warren Isaac '65** - Iona's only 50-point scorer, Isaac played six seasons in Europe following his tenure at Iona. A New York City school legend, Isaac started for Power Memorial paving the way for NBA Hall of Famer Kareem Abdul-Jabbar a 1965 graduate of the high school.
- **Tim Welsh** - head coach from 1995-98 who went on to coach in the Big East with Providence for 10 seasons. Currently an ESPN college basketball analyst. Holds the highest career winning percentage ever at Iona.
- **Kevin Willard** - Iona coach from 2007-10, now head coach at Big East's Seton Hall. Helped turn around a

program which won two games in the season prior to his arrival to 20 wins in his final season in Maroon & Gold.

- **Steve Burt '84 & Steve Burt '06** - All-time NCAA father/son scoring leaders, both netting over 2,000 career points. Burt, the father, had a four-season NBA career and most notably appeared off the bench for the Phoenix Suns in the 1992 NBA Playoffs. He was inducted into the prestigious NYC Basketball Hall of Fame this past fall. Burt, the son, continues to play professionally in Europe.
- **Sean Green '91** - Played 84 NBA games over three seasons for the Indiana Pacers, Philadelphia 76ers and Utah Jazz from 1991-94. Currently a high school basketball coach in Southern California.
- **Scott Machado '12** - The last Gael to appear in an NBA game. Machado played in regular season NBA contests in 2012-13 with the Houston Rockets and postseason with the Golden State Warriors. Played the majority 2018-19 season in the NBA G-League for the South Bay Lakers and played four games with the Los Angeles Lakers. The MAAC & Iona's all-time assist leader. He currently plays professionally in Australia.
- **Bob Santini '53** - Iona's first NBA player, appeared in four games with the New York Knicks in 1955-56.

NOTABLE ALUMNI (ATHLETICS/POP CULTURE)

- **Brendan Malone '62** - longtime NBA assistant coach, last with the Detroit Pistons from 2014-16.
- **Don McLean** - Singer-songwriter noted most famous for his 1971 single "American Pie".
- **Dennis Leonard** - Kansas City Royals Hall of Famer and 12-year MLB veteran who won 20 games on three occasions from 1977-80. He was inducted in May 2015 into the New York Baseball Hall of Fame.
- **Kyle Flood '93** - Former head football coach at Rutgers, current OL coach at Alabama.
- **Maggie Timoney '89** - The Iona women's basketball Hall of Famer recently became the first female CEO of Heineken USA.
- **Jason Motte** - Major League Baseball relief pitcher recorded the final out of the 2011 World Series with the world champion St. Louis Cardinals. Has also appeared in Major League games with the Chicago Cubs, Colorado Rockies and Atlanta Braves.
- **Leonard Korir '12** - a two time NCAA track and field champion while at Iona, Korir represented Team USA in the 2016 Rio Olympic Games in the 10,000-meter event. He is currently ranked as the top American marathon runner on WorldAthletics.org.
- **Amanda Saccomanno '13** - World Wrestling Entertainment's (WWE) Mandy Rose, competes on the SmackDown brand.
- **Ignacio Maganto** - was selected by the LA Galaxy with the 21st pick in the first round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, the first Major League Soccer draft pick in Iona history. Maganto scored his first MLS goal with the Galaxy in the spring of 2015.
- **Mariano Rivera III '15** - Earned his degree in May 2015 and was selected in the fourth round by the Washington Nationals.

"Berrick fits so well with our style of play," said Pitino. "He is an outstanding defensive player and is explosive on offense in the open court. I'm excited to have him in our running style of play."

BEFORE IONA

JeanLouis comes to New Rochelle following a year with Florida Southwestern State College in Fort Myers, Florida, where he averaged 12.9 points and 4.1 rebounds in 25 minutes per game. The ultra-athletic, 6-4 wing was ranked No. 27 on JUCORecruiting.com's Top 100 on a squad that finished 29-2 in a season cut short prior to the NJCAA National Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He played his freshman year at New Mexico State University alongside fellow newcomer Robert Brown and outgoing graduate student Mo Thiam. JeanLouis appeared in 15 games off the bench with the Aggies.

JeanLouis spent his final two scholastic seasons at Canterbury School in Fort Myers where he helped guide the Cougars to the FHSAA Class 3A finals as a senior. The team went undefeated (14-0) in District 6 play and was 21-6 overall. He averaged 18 points, seven rebounds, four assists, two steals and a block in his senior season. As a junior, he averaged 17 points, seven rebounds, five assists, two steals and a block. The Cougars also finished the 2016-17 season with a 21-6 overall mark and were 12-3 in league play. He spent his first two years at Lehigh Acres High School. The explosive athlete was also a two-time Florida high jump state champion as well as a regional champion in the long jump.
