The Iona College men's basketball team (0-0) begins the 2021-22 campaign at home against Appalachian State (0-0) on opening night for NCAA Basketball. The Gaels and Mountaineers square off at the Hynes Center on ESPN3 in a 7 p.m. tipoff.

## IONA VS. APP STATE - SERIES HISTORY

- Iona meets App State for the first time in history tonight.
- It will be the second time for Rick Pitino against the Mountaineers, following an 80-53 win by Louisville on Nov. 23 2009 at Freedom Hall.

## SCOUTING APP STATE

- The defending Sun Belt Conference tournament champions arrive in New Rochelle, picked to finish fourth in the league in the preseason coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers earned a 17-12 overall mark and were 7-8 in Sun Belt play before a conference tournament run put them in the NCAA First Four.
- App State returns its top four scorers from last season including senior Justin Forrest (13.2 ppg), senior Adrian Delph (13.0), graduate Michael Almonacy (12.7) and junior Donovan Gregory (10.7).

- The team's top three scorers combined for 186 of the team's 233 three-pointers last season, led by Almonacy's 71.

Gregory led with 6.1 rpg and Almonacy led with 2.9 apg.

## IONA VERSUS THE SUN BELT CONFERENCE

Iona is 0-1 all-time vs. current Sun Belt Conference opponents following its loss to Coastal Carolina in the Island of the Bahamas Invitational in November 2017.

## IONA IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Gaels have posted a 50-24 record in their first game of the season since 1945.
- Iona opens the season at home for just the second time in seven seasons.
- The Maroon & Gold is 15-2 all-time in season openers at the Hynes Center and 35-5 all-time, earning four straight wins.
- It is the first time since Nov. 9, 2018 (Albany) the Gaels open the season at home.

## OPENING NIGHT HEAVYWEIGHTS

- Of the 184 NCAA Division I games on opening night only five feature teams who both played in the 2021 NCAA Tournament.
- The games include: App State at Iona, Mount St. Mary's at Villanova, Texas Southern at Oregon, Cleveland State at BYU, and Kansas vs. Michigan State at Madison Square Garden.

## JR JOSEPH NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MAAC

- Sophomore **Nelly Junior Joseph** was the lone representative of the Gaels and was selected to the Preseason All-MAAC First Team by the league's 11 head coaches.
- Junior Joseph is the reigning MAAC Rookie of the Year.

## GAELS PICKED FIRST IN MAAC PRESEASON POLL

- Iona was unanimously selected to finish first in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll released Oct. 19 coming off a 6-3 performance in a COVID-19 pandemic stunted regular season in 2020-21.
- The Gaels have captured a league best 10 regular season championships in 40 MAAC seasons.

## WHO'S BACK?

- Iona returns **10** players from 2020-21 campaign including starters **Berrick JeanLouis** and **Nelly Junior Joseph** and sixth-man **Dylan van Eyck**.
- Sophomore **Ryan Myers** also returns and looks for an elevated role after being a key player off the bench as a rookie.
- The Gaels also return graduate **Colton Cashaw**, senior **Robert Brown**, junior **Osborn Shema** and freshman **Trey James**.
- Walk on juniors **James Carey** and **Parker Weiss** also return for another season in Maroon & Gold.
- The Gaels graduated four student-athletes last season. van Eyck and Cashaw returned for a final season while **Isaiah Ross** and **Asante Gist** moved on to professional careers in the NBA G-League.

## WHAT'S NEW?

- Six players made their Iona debut this season including three high-major transfers and three true freshmen.
- American Conference graduate transfers **Elijah Joiner** (Tulsa) and **Tyson Jolly** (SMU) will make an immediate impact in the Gael lineup. Joiner was No. 2 in scoring at Tulsa (11.3 ppg) and led the team with

4.0 apg. Jolly was Third Team All-AAC as a junior in 2019-20, averaging 14.5 ppg before an injury plagued senior campaign limited him to just eight contests.

- ACC transfer **Quinn Slazinski** started eight of Louisville's 20 games last season and averaged 6.2 points and 3.6 rebounds in 21.1 mpg.
- Rookies **Walter Clayton Jr.**, **Joshua Duach** and **Jordan Wildy** will also make their debut.

## KING OF THE HILL, TOP OF THE LIST

- No team among the 14 NYC Metropolitan Area Division I basketball programs within 30 miles of the center of NY College basketball, Madison Square Garden has won more games than Iona College in the 27 seasons (477; Hofstra #2, 464).
- Over the last decade, Iona's 223 wins and .630 win percentage are also the best in both categories. (Seton Hall, 205 wins; .577 win pct.)
- Since 1995-96, the Maroon & Gold hold the lead in wins (477), 13 more than Hofstra, 33 more than No. 3 Seton Hall and the top win percentage (.586).
- Iona's 10 postseason appearances (seven NCAA, two NIT, one CIT) since 2010-11 are the most during the time frame, **twice as many** Seton Hall (4 NCAA, 1 NIT) and St. John's (three NCAA, two NIT).

## RICK PITINO ERA YEAR TWO

- Iona College is in its second season under Hall of Fame head coach **Rick Pitino** in 2020-21
- Coach Pitino was tabbed to lead the program on March 14, 2020 after **Tim Cluess** stepped down for health reasons following the most successful decade in Iona basketball history.
- Coach Pitino spent the prior two seasons Panathinaikos B.C. (PAN-ah-tin-IKE-ohs) in the EuroLeague in Greece.
- The Naismith Hall of Famer begins his 34th year as a head coach of an NCAA Division I program.
- Coach Pitino has led Hawaii, Boston University, Providence, Kentucky, Louisville and Iona to **782** career wins, seven final fours, and two national titles among his numerous career accomplishments.
- The New York native returned home to the Metropolitan area where it all started. Growing up in Manhattan, Pitino starred for the CHSAA's St. Dominic High School on Long Island before his collegiate playing days at UMass and long coaching career.
- He also coached several years with the New York Knicks and Boston Celtics in the NBA.

**GAELS IN GREECE**

- Iona traveled to Greece this summer from August 19-30 and played five exhibition games as part of a summer foreign tour heading into the 2021-22 season.
- The Maroon & Gold took on four high-level teams during the trip, competing against Ionikos, Lavrio, Panathinaikos and Peristeri. All four are members of the top tier Greek Basketball League.
- The Gaels posted a 1-4 record, put a scare into Coach Pitino's former team and EuroLeague participant Panathinaikos and defeated Ionikos in the trips final game.
- Off days in Greece allowed for visiting culturally significant sites in the Athens area and a weekend trip to the island of Spetses.

**ROSS, GIST DRAFTED BY NBA G-LEAGUE**

- Both of Iona's departing 2021-22 seniors look to continue their basketball careers at the professional level this upcoming season.
- **Isaiah Ross** was the 18th overall pick by the Maine Celtics and was traded to the Santa Cruz Warriors. Santa Cruz is the former team of Gael Great **Scott Machado**.
- **Asante Gist** was drafted by the hometown Westchester Knicks with the third pick of the third round. The Knicks will play their 2021-22 campaign at Bridgeport, CT's Webster Bank Arena. He played in the NBA Summer League with the Washington Wizards.

**COLLEGEINSIDER.COM MID MAJOR TOP 25**

- Iona was ranked No. 13 on the CollegeInsider.com Men's Mid-Major Top 25 in the preseason release on Nov. 1
- Iona's beefed up schedule sees the program playing No. 5 Liberty, No. 19 Yale, three programs receiving votes (Delaware, Harvard, Marist) and either No. 2 Belmont or No. 4 Drake in its second game at the ESPN Events Invitational.
- All six contests will take place in the first two months of the season.

**2020-21 COVID ISSUES**

- Iona College men's basketball faced multiple pauses during the 2020-21 campaign due to COVID-19 issues within the program, including a 51-day layoff from Dec. 23 - Feb. 12. It was the longest layoff in NCAA Division I of the season.
- Four programs experienced gaps in playing time of more than 40 days including the Gaels' MAAC counterpart Canisius.
- It would not be the last pause, as the Gaels faced another 17-day layoff prior to their historic run in the MAAC tournament from Mar. 9-13.
- Iona played just 18 total games and nine in league play in 2020-21.

**BUSTING THE (MAAC) BRACKET**

- The No. 9 seed never won nor reached the MAAC Championship game in the event's history until this season.
- The previous lowest seed to reach the MAAC final was Fairfield, a No. 8 seed, in 1997.
- Iona is the No. 9 seed for the first time in history.

**JR JOSEPH NAMED ROOKIE OF THE YEAR**

- Freshman **Nelly Junior Joseph** became the fourth MAAC Rookie of the Year in program history and first since **Schadrac Casimir** in 2015.
- Junior Joseph and Casimir are joined by **Scott Machado** (2009) and **Richie Simmonds** (1985) as MAAC Rookies of the Year from Iona.

**SULTAN OF SWIPE**

- Junior **Berrick JeanLouis** led the MAAC in the regular season with 2.31 steals per game.
- It is the third time in the last five years an Iona player has led the league in steals, following **Rickey McGill** in 2016-18 and 2018-19.
- Former Gael great Rickey Soliver also led the league in steals in 2005-06.

**ABOUT CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT TITLES**

- Iona is the only NCAA Division I program to capture its last five straight completed conference tournament championships and holds the nation's longest active streak.
- Only three programs have won at least six tournament titles in the last decade. Iona's six during the time frame is only eclipsed by Gonzaga (8) and New Mexico State (7).

- 23 of the 357 NCAA Division I programs have appeared in at least seven of the last nine NCAA Tournaments. **Only three of the 23 have come from mid-major conferences** (Gonzaga [8], Iona [7] and New Mexico State [7]).
- Nine teams in the 2021 NCAA Tournament Field have been in at least the last five straight tournaments, from 2016-present. The staggering list includes: Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina, Purdue, Villanova, and Virginia

## LET IT RAIN

- Entering this season, Iona has made a three-pointer in **410** straight and **857** out of its last **859** games.
- In 2019-20, the Gaels eclipsed their previous program record of 385 straight from Jan. 5, 1994 - Dec. 16, 2006.
- The Gaels have failed to hit a three-pointer in just 18 of their **1,085** games played since the line was adopted for the 1986-87 season.

## LUCKY 13, SIX CONFERENCES, FIVE TEAMS

- Iona won its league record 13th MAAC Tournament Championship last weekend. The next highest total is five, shared by Siena and Manhattan.
- **Rick Pitino** earned his 13th conference tournament championship in 33 seasons as a Division I head coach.
- Coach Pitino has won championships with Boston University (1983), Kentucky (1992-95, 1996), Louisville (2003, 2005, 2009, 2012-14) and now Iona (2021).
- Rick Pitino is the only coach in NCAA Div. I history to win tournaments in six difference conferences (ECAC North, SEC, Conference USA, Big East, American and MAAC).
- Coach Pitino is also just the third head coach in D-I history to take five different schools to the NCAA tournament, joining Tubby Smith and Lon Kruger.

## SIX DECADE CLUB

- With Iona's win at Hofstra, Naismith Hall of Fame head coach **Rick Pitino** joined an exclusive club, becoming the sixth head coach to win a Division I college basketball game in six different decades.
- Coach Pitino won his first game in the 1970s with the University of Hawaii in 1976. His stint at Boston University wrapped around the turn of the 1980s decade, where he also won games with Providence and Kentucky. He spent eight seasons with the Wildcats, all in the 1990s. His 2000s and 2010s victories all came while at the Louisville. His first win at Iona on Dec. 5, 2020, also his first this decade.
- Coach Pitino joined contemporaries **Cliff Ellis**, **Jim Boeheim** and **Mike Krzyzewski** who joined the list last season.
- **Bill Reinhart** (1910s-1960s, Oregon, George Washington) and **Tony Hinkle** (1920s-1970s, Butler) were the lone members prior to the turn of the calendar in January.
- **Phog Allen** of Kansas lore, came very close— he coached from the 1900s to the 1950s but in the 1910s, his only year at a Div. I school was at Kansas in 1919-20. The Jayhawks won their first four games that season, but the season opener took place on January 6, 1920. Allen remains one of many "five-decaders".

- The MAAC announced its Time Out for Black Lives initiative, aiming to inspire and educate youth, athletes, families and fans.
- Time Out for Black Lives is an interactive website where coaches and student-athletes from MAAC basketball programs contribute their time and resources to read children's books in entertaining videos, all focusing on Black culture, history, music and myths.
- The program is a part of the MAAC's United for Justice campaign announced this summer.
- Iona head coach **Rick Pitino** participated in the effort, reading "A Nation's Hope: The Story of Boxing Legend Joe Louis," a story written by Matt De La Pena and illustrated by Kadir Nelson.

- The initiative was brought to the MAAC by Coach Pitino following his experience in Greece where a similar reading program sought to teach English to Greek children (Time Out for English).

## RICHIE GUERIN'S #14 HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

- Iona honored the legacy of **Richie Guerin '54** by retiring his number 14 on Jan. 31, 2014 the first ever in school history.
- Guerin is an Iona College Goal Club (1983), Marine Corps Sports (2004), and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (2013) inductee who starred for the Maroon & Gold from 1951-1954.
- He rewrote the basketball record books at Iona, scoring 1,375 points and graduated as the leading scorer in school history.
- A two-time All-Metropolitan selection with the Gaels, he scored a then school-record 40 points against John Carroll in 1954 and was the first Gael to score 40 or more points in a game.
- Following his playing days at Iona, Guerin played with the National Basketball Association's New York Knicks from 1956-1963 and was a player-coach of the St. Louis/Atlanta Hawks franchise for nine years.
- In 13 years as a professional player, Guerin accumulated 14,676 points (17.3 per game), 4,278 rebounds (5.1 per game), and 4,211 assists (5.0 per game) over 848 games.

**Gael Greats**

In addition to Naismith Hall of Famer **Richie Guerin '54**, here are additional significant names in Iona basketball history:

- **Jim Valvano** - legendary head coach at Iona from 1975-80 who "Dared To Dream" to win a national championship with the Gaels and finally did in 1983, albeit with North Carolina State. Succumbed to cancer in 1993 eight weeks after an impassioned speech at the ESPY Awards that year which in which he announced creation of The V Foundation for Cancer Research and its motto, "Don't Give Up... Don't Ever Give Up."
- **Jeff Ruland '91** - All-American during his time at Iona and, two-time NBA All-Star with the Washington Bullets, Philadelphia 76ers and Detroit Pistons. Following his career, returned to Iona and served as head coach from 1998-2007 where he won three MAAC Championships.
- **Tim Cluess** - head coach from 2010-2020. At the helm during one the Gaels' most successful decades in program history. Cluess won 199 games in nine seasons on the sideline including six NCAA appearances, five MAAC tournament championships, and four MAAC regular season titles. He is the all-time MAAC leader in MAAC tournament victories.
- **Pat Kennedy** - head coach from 1980-86. Went on to coach at Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson following a highly successful tenure in New Rochelle.
- **Warren Isaac '65** - Iona's only 50-point scorer, Isaac played six seasons in Europe following his tenure at Iona. A New York City school legend, Isaac started for Power Memorial paving the way for NBA Hall of Famer Kareem Abdul-Jabbar a 1965 graduate of the high school.
- **Tim Welsh** - head coach from 1995-98 who went on to coach in the Big East with Providence for 10 seasons. Currently an ESPN college basketball analyst. Holds the highest career winning percentage ever at Iona.
- **Kevin Willard** - Iona coach from 2007-10, now head coach at Big East's Seton Hall. Helped turn around a program which won two games in the season prior to his arrival to 20 wins in his final season in Maroon & Gold.
- **Steve Burtt '84 & Steve Burtt '06** - All-time NCAA father/son scoring leaders, both netting over 2,000 career points. Burtt, the father, had a four-season NBA career and most notably appeared off the bench for the Phoenix Suns in the 1992 NBA Playoffs. He was inducted into the prestigious NYC Basketball Hall of Fame this past fall. Burtt, the son, continues to play professionally in Europe.
- **Sean Green '91** - Played 84 NBA games over three seasons for the Indiana Pacers, Philadelphia 76ers and Utah Jazz from 1991-94. Currently a high school basketball coach in Southern California.
- **Scott Machado '12** - The last Gael to appear in an NBA game. Machado played in regular season NBA contests in 2012-13 with the Houston Rockets and postseason with the Golden State Warriors. Played the majority 2018-19 season in

the NBA G-League for the South Bay Lakers and played four games with the Los Angeles Lakers. The MAAC & Iona's all-time assist leader. He currently plays professionally in Australia.

- **Bob Santini '53** - Iona's first NBA player, appeared in four games with the New York Knicks in 1955-56.

**NOTABLE ALUMNI (ATHLETICS/POP CULTURE)**

- **Brendan Malone '62** - longtime NBA assistant coach, last with the Detroit Pistons from 2014-16.
- **Don McLean** - Singer-songwriter noted most famous for his 1971 single "American Pie".
- **Dennis Leonard** - Kansas City Royals Hall of Famer and 12-year MLB veteran who won 20 games on three occasions from 1977-80. He was inducted in May 2015 into the New York Baseball Hall of Fame.
- **Kyle Flood '93** - Former head football coach at Rutgers, current OL coach at Alabama.
- **Maggie Timoney '89** - The Iona women's basketball Hall of Famer recently \_became the first female CEO of Heineken USA.
- **Jason Motte** - Major League Baseball relief pitcher recorded the final out of the 2011 World Series with the world champion St. Louis Cardinals. Has also appeared in Major League games with the Chicago Cubs, Colorado Rockies and Atlanta Braves.
- **Leonard Korir '12** - a two time NCAA track and field champion while at Iona, Korir represented Team USA in the 2016 Rio Olympic Games in the 10,000-meter event. He is currently ranked as the top American marathon runner on WorldAthletics.org.
- **Amanda Saccomanno '13** - World Wrestling Entertainment's (WWE) Mandy Rose, competes on the SmackDown brand.
- **Ignacio Maganto** - was selected by the LA Galaxy with the 21st pick in the first round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, the first Major League Soccer draft pick in Iona history. Maganto scored his first MLS goal with the Galaxy in the spring of 2015.
- **Mariano Rivera III '15** - Earned his degree in May 2015 and was selected in the fourth round by the Washington Nationals.

# Rick PITINO

## Head Coach

### Massachusetts '74 - Second Season

Naismith Hall of Famer Rick Pitino was named head basketball coach of Iona College on March 14, 2020. Coach Pitino has taken four different programs to the NCAA tournament and coached two national championship teams. During his 33 previous seasons as a collegiate head coach, Rick Pitino held a **782-277** overall record and a 54-20 record in the NCAA Tournament. He became the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four and first coach to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools. Pitino holds the third highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.740) among all active coaches.

Pitino, who has a stellar reputation for success on the court and a dedication to student-athlete academic success, has served as head coach of the University of Louisville (2001-2017, winning the 2013 NCAA Championship), University of Kentucky (1989-1997, winning the 1996 NCAA Championship), Providence College (1985-1987), Boston University (1978-1983) and Hawaii (last six games 1975-1976). And, while often choosing to do so anonymously, Rick has served as a charitable benefactor for a broad spectrum of worthy causes.

# IONA COLLEGE NOTES OF INTEREST

- Founded in 1940, Iona is inspired by the legacy of Blessed Edmund Rice and the Christian Brothers, embodying opportunity, justice and the liberating power of education.
- Iona's beautiful 45-acre campus in New Rochelle, N.Y., is only two miles from the Long Island Sound and 20 miles north of Midtown Manhattan.
- Iona College is a small Catholic liberal arts college that has emerged as an anomaly in higher education, with new-student enrollment spiking over 30 percent in two years (despite being on the front lines of COVID-19 when the virus first hit New Rochelle in March 2020).
- Iona was awarded the #20 spot in U.S. News & World Report's list of "Most Innovative Schools" in the north region.
- The College recently acquired the 28-acre campus of Concordia College in nearby Bronxville, N.Y.
- With the support of a \$20 million gift from NewYork-Presbyterian, Iona has established the NewYork-Presbyterian Iona School of Health Sciences on the new Iona Bronxville campus, developing a premier new school in collaboration with New York's #1 hospital.
- Iona has started construction on a vibrant new green space in the heart of campus, which will be done by the spring of 2022, called the "Murphy Green." It will be a lively outdoor landscape where students can enjoy a variety of social, recreational, academic and artistic activities.
- Iona College recently launched its new Club Sports program, which is geared toward those with an interest in organized sports outside of Iona's rigorous Division I Athletics program. This program also includes an eSports club, set to compete in Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.
- Tradition: Iona's Pipe Band performs at major campus events, such as Homecoming and Commencement, and even leads the College's march up Fifth Avenue in the New York City St. Patrick's Day parade. The Iona College Pipe Band was also awarded first place in the College and High School Pipes and Drums division in the 2019 NYC St. Patrick's Day parade awards.
- Iona hired Hall of Fame men's basketball coach **Rick Pitino** in March 2020; he is eager to claim the team's 14th MAAC Championship and go further in the NCAA Tournament than ever before!



## PRESIDENT SEAMUS CAREY, Ph.D.

- Seamus Carey, Ph.D., serves as the ninth president of Iona College.
- A Bronx native and first-generation college student, Carey began his Iona presidency in July 2019.
- Just a few months into his leadership, President Carey was among the first to contend with the COVID-19 pandemic. He swiftly closed campus in March due to Iona's proximity to the New Rochelle outbreak, shifting all learning to online platforms. Pushing to innovate and lead through the pandemic, Iona was also one of the first in the nation to reopen.
- Propelling the College on a path of innovation, President Carey has since overseen the launch of Iona's new brand, new nursing program, and two new undergraduate programs in entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial leadership. He has also presided over the grand reopening of the newly renovated LaPenta School of Business, in addition to the opening of the Hynes Institute for Entrepreneurship & Innovation.



## WHAT IS A GAEL?

- The symbol of Iona College's athletic teams is the popular Gael. A Gael is anyone of Irish-Gaelic ancestry, consistent with the Irish tradition of Iona. The College was founded in 1940 by the Congregation of Christian Brothers, commonly known as the Irish Christian Brothers.
- The Gael, which is depicted as a spunky character, provides Iona with a nickname consistent with the school motto, *certa bonum certame* ("fight the good fight") and personifies strength.
